The Israelites (Hebrews) were slaves in Egypt. The king ordered that all of their baby boys be killed. One family hid their baby and he was safe.

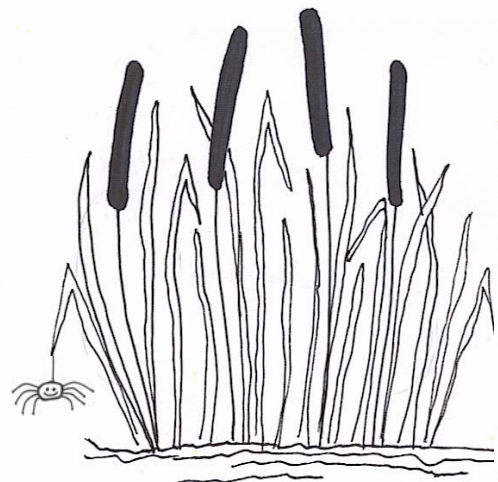
